School Philosophy and Community

Mentor College is a private co-educational day school located in Port Credit, Mississauga. Since its founding in 1982, the School has provided a strong academic program. Students are encouraged to think and reason for themselves, in a caring environment which is rich personal attention and positive atmosphere. The high school (grades 9 to 12) and intermediate (grades 5 to 8) divisions are housed on the Main Campus. An adjacent Primary Campus is home to the JK to Grade 4 students. Extra-curricular trips to the school's Outdoor Education Centre in Muskoka, and Internationally for athletics, academics or humanitarian service enhance the program. Other extra-curricular activities abound and include athletics, music, drama, arts and special interest clubs.

The High School Program

The comprehensive High School Program is four years long and focuses on the academic, University stream courses that earn the student the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). There are 662 multi-cultural students enrolled in the High School Division, balanced between gender. The school is inspected and accredited by the Ontario Ministry of Education and is a member of the College Board, delivering Advanced Placement (AP) Courses and Exams to senior students.

Curriculum

A complete listing of the Ontario Credit and AP courses offered at Mentor College is updated each year on the school website, www.mentorcollege.edu. Emphasis in course offerings is on those that are the necessary prerequisites for entry into a wide array of University programs. The courses are offered in a full-year time period. Up to eight subjects can be taken per year in a daily schedule that comprises six classes and a lunch period, running from 8:45am to 3:15pm.

Grading and Ranking

In Ontario the credit courses are given a final grade as a percentage. For conversion of grades the school follows the following summary:

Prerequisite courses at Mentor College must be completed with a minimum 60% mark.
Mentor College does not rank students.

Graduation Requirements

The Ontario requirements for graduation are listed on the school website. The student must complete 30 credits (courses) in four years and complete a minimum of 40 hours of community service. The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) must also be successfully completed, and this is usually done in grade 10.

Graduating Class of 2018

There were 167 graduates in the class of 2019. 141 graduates earned honours standing (Ontario Scholars) with an average above 80%. The average mark of grade 12 graduates applying to University was 87.2%

University and Post-Secondary Placement

164 students of 167 graduates, or 98.2% matriculated to Post Secondary Studies. 81% were accepted at their University of first choice. 159 attend University and 5 attend Community College. 3 continued in other studies and work or travel.

Advanced Placement and Literacy Test Results

In May, 2019, 83 students wrote AP exams in 11 subjects. 68 students earned University credits and 46 achieved perfect scores of 5. Mentor College students consistently outperform the AP student averages in other AP schools nationally. In April, 2019, 180 students in grade 10 wrote the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test. 93% of the Mentor students were successful compared to a Provincial success rate of 79%.
