School Philosophy and Community

Mentor College is a private co-educational day school, founded in 1981, and provides an enriched academic programme for its students. A caring environment that is rich in personal attention has been established, and this positive atmosphere both allows and encourages students to think and reason for themselves. Located in Port Credit, Mississauga, the high school (grades 9 to 12) and intermediate (grades 5 to 8) divisions are housed on the Main Campus. An adjacent Primary Campus is home to the JK to Grade 4 students.

Extra-curricular trips to the school's Outdoor Education Centre in Muskoka, and Internationally for athletics, academics or humanitarian service efforts enhance the programme. Other extra-curricular activities abound and include athletics, music, drama, arts and special interest clubs.

The High School Programme

The comprehensive High School Programme is four years long and focuses on the academic, University stream courses that earn the student the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). There are 665 multi-cultural students enrolled in the High School Division, balanced between gender. The school is inspected and accredited by the Ontario Ministry of Education and is a member of the College Board, delivering Advanced Placement (AP) Courses and Exams to senior students.

<u>Curriculum</u>

A complete listing of the Ontario Credit and AP courses offered at Mentor College is updated each year on the school website, www.mentorcollege.edu. Emphasis in course offerings is on those that are the necessary prerequisites for entry into a wide array of University programmes.

The courses are normally offered in a full-year schedule. Up to eight subjects can be taken per year in a daily schedule that comprises six classes and a lunch period, running from 8:45 to 3:15.

Grading and Ranking

In Ontario the credit courses are given a final grade as a percentage. For conversion of grades the school follows the following summary:

Graduation Requirements

The Ontario requirements for graduation are listed on the school website. The student must complete 30 credits (courses) in four years and complete a minimum of 40 hours of community service. The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) must also be successfully completed, and this is usually done in grade 10.

Graduating Class of 2021

There were 170 graduates in the class of 2021.

153 graduates earned honours (Ontario Scholars) standing over 80% average

The average mark of grade 12 graduates applying to University was 91.2%

University and Post-Secondary Placement

167 students of 170 graduates, or 98% matriculated to University. 84% of graduates were accepted at their University of first choice. 3 continued in other studies and work or travel.

Advanced Placement (AP) and Literacy Test Results

In May, 2021, 37 students wrote online AP exams in 7 subjects. 35 earned University credit, and 18 received

perfect scores of 5. Mentor College Students consistently outperform the AP student averages in other AP schools nationally.

In April 2019, 180 students in grade 10 wrote the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test. 93% of the Mentor students were successful. (This was 79% success in the rest of Ontario). In 2020 and 2021 the OSSLT was not written in Ontario because of COVID-19.
